



Dear customers,

Please note that you are responsible for the contents of your mail and its compliance with the regulations.

In order to avoid any inconvenience and consequences you are kindly requested to respect the regulations and prohibitions when sending goods by mail. Consult your Post if necessary.

Your mail items can be refused for transport if the contents description on the Customs declaration does not make it clear that no dangerous goods are enclosed. If your item is refused for transport at one of the airports, it may be returned to you and a return charge and eventual fines may apply.

Examples of prohibited and allowed items

General description of goods in mail items*	Examples of prohibited items	Examples of allowed items
Automobile parts and spares	Flammable fuel additives, spray paints, air bags	Mirrors, seat covers
Batteries	Lithium-ion and polymer batteries, lithium metal batteries	Alcaline, nickel-cadmium, zinc-carbon, nickel-metal hydride batteries
Electronic and electrical devices	Lithium-ion and polymer batteries, lithium metal batteries	Devices for connection to the mains (220 V)
Toys	Lithium batteries	Building bricks, construction toys
Household goods	Aerosol spray cans, corrosive cleansing agents	Food, clothes
Cosmetics	Perfumes, nail varnish and solvents, aerosol spray cans	Soap, lipstick
Camping equipment	Gas cartridges and tanks, solid fuels (wood charcoal), matches, lighters	Tent, sleeping bags
Diving equipment	Diving tanks, submersible lamps containing batteries – source of strong heat	Wetsuits, diving masks, breathing tubes
Sports equipment	Ammunition, gas cartridges, thermal clothes containing lithium batteries	Rackets, balls, sports shoes

Check the mail contents!

Does your mail contain any dangerous goods?

Did you know that many everyday items, such as aerosols, nail varnish, perfumes, chemicals or electronic equipment present a safety hazard and are to be handled in accordance with the relevant legislation related to air mail transport?

Vibrations, temperature and pressure changes during the flight may cause liquid leaks, emissions of toxic gases or provoke a fire.



Every mail item containing any dangerous and prohibited goods can cause an accident with devastating consequences for human lives, environment and property.

If the item (object or substance) you are sending is labelled with one of the GHS hazard pictograms shown below, it means that it presents a safety hazard and it is **forbidden** to send it by air transport.

1. EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES AND ITEMS

- Fireworks
- Firecrackers
- Ammunition
- Gunpowder
- Flares
- Signal flares



2. COMPRESSED OR LIQUID GASES

- Aerosol spray cans
- Lighters (gas)
- Lighters refill (gas)
- Driving tanks
- Camping gas (butane)



3. FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS

- Fuel lighters
- Paints, varnishes and enamels
- Adhesives, solvents
- Perfumes and nail varnish
- Alcoholic drinks (above 24% ABV)



4. FLAMMABLE SUBSTANCES

- Matches
- Charcoal
- Metal powders
- Calcium carbide



5. OXIDIZING SUBSTANCES

- Oxygen producing chemicals
- Hydrogen Peroxide
- Bleach
- Cleansing agents



6. TOXIC AND CONTAGIOUS SUBSTANCES

- Pesticides
- Chemicals for agriculture
- Mercury compounds
- Bacteria and viruses



7. RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS

- Radionuclides for medical diagnostics
- Cardiac pacemakers
- Instruments containing radiation source



8. CORROSIVES

- Wet batteries
- Mercury
- Hydrochloric acid
- Corrosive cleansing agents



9. MISCELLANEOUS DANGEROUS GOODS (1)

- Internal combustion motors (lawn mowers, motor saws)
- Environmentally hazardous substances
- Magnetized goods
- Dry ice (solid carbon dioxide)



9. MISCELLANEOUS DANGEROUS GOODS (2)

- Lithium-ion batteries
- Lithium metal batteries
- Electronic devices with inserted lithium batteries (smartphones, tablets, portable computers, cameras etc.)
